



Sustainability currently seems to be the global buzzword within the building and construction industry due to climate change and increasing population through urbanisation.

With the increase in devastating global warming events, construction professionals (Architects, Engineers, Quantity Surveyors, Planners and Environmentalists) rethink the way buildings are designed and constructed. This is often referred to as "Sustainable Construction" and "Green Building" by changes in design, procurement, and management processes in order to integrate the principles of sustainability into buildings/developments.

The Quantity Surveyor plays a critical role in ensuring that new and upcoming developments are brought in line with the most cost-effective sustainable strategies associated with well-placed value management and engineering contributions to not only bring down the green capital cost, but also optimise life-cycle economic performance, enhance energy performance, green rating strategies and so on.

The Traditional Role of Quantity Surveyors

Generally, the traditional roles of Quantity Surveyors are to perform financial control, cost and contractual administration of a project at every stage, from inception to completion. The responsibilities of a traditional Quantity Surveyor can be described as follows:

The Expanded Role of Quantity Surveyors

The role of the Quantity Surveyor is evolving to keep up with sustainable needs, so, how has the role of the Quantity Surveyor changed over the years?

The Developer engages the Quantity Surveyor at the very early stage of a development and way before any construction has taken place to utilise his or her expertise in the feasibility, design and planning stage to achieve the best value in regard to the extra over costs for achieving the different levels of green building rating certification.

The Quantity Surveyor often supports in avoiding over-specification, minimise energy use through recommending new technologies, reduce waste by avoiding the intensive use of materials etc. The Quantity Surveyor should have the sound knowledge on the environmentally friendly technologies and innovations and keep up to date with the new and emerging building materials that allow him to advice on the cost of developments and inform the design team on the parameters of efficiencies, design factors and concepts.

The underlisted topics to be treated will provide the Quantity Surveyor with the required knowledge in his or her expanded role in sustainable construction:

- 1. Requirements of Green Buildings/Sustainable Designs and Integration
- 2. Green Building Rating Certifications EDGE, LEED, BREEAM
- 3. Sustainable Procurement: The Role of the Quantity Surveyor
- 4. Green Costing, Life-Cycle Costing and Assessment







Surv Rosemargaret Esubonteng, FGhIS, MRICS (Rev Mrs)

Introduction

Surv. Rosemargaret Esubonteng was sworn in as the 50thPresident of the Ghana Institution of Surveyors on the 25th of February 2022, becoming the first Female Quantity Surveyor to hold the position.

Rosemargaretis a Chartered Quantity Surveyor and Project Manager who has worked with both Private and Public Sector Clients; a Fellow of the Ghana Institution of Surveyors (GhIS) and a Member of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors (RICS). She has worked as a built environment professional for more than thirtyseven years.

Her academic qualifications include an MBA (Construction & Real Estate) from the University of Reading, UK, a Post Graduate Diploma in Project Management awarded by the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors, and a BSc (Hons) Building Technology from the Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology, Kumasi, Ghana. As one who believes that continuous education keeps one abreast with or ahead of the times, she has been taking a number of short courses and has been to several seminars and conferences.

She is a Proud Old Girl of Wesley Girls High School, Cape Coast in Ghana. She supports the activities and work of her Year Group and willingly assists with construction projects undertaken by other Year Groups.

Little did Rosemargaret know how much of a gender trailblazer she would be in her Surveyor's walk. She was the only female who joined the 1979 cohort of Building Technology students at the University of Science and Technology.

Twenty years ago, she became the Founder and Principal Consultant in OshDarley Consult, a Quantity Surveying and Project Management Consulting Firm in Ghana. OshDarley Consult is the first, and currently the only Quantity Surveying Consulting Firm registered with GhIS that has been founded and led by a woman.

Prior to starting OshDarley Consult, she worked at G. Ampofo & Partners, and at the then Technical Services Centre of the Ministry of Works and Housing in Accra.

She is a sought-after Resource Person for different Professional Training Programmes and Seminars. Her speaking engagements span professional, social, academic, and religious fields.

Service to the Surveying Profession

Her journey in the Ghana Institution of Surveyors began in 1987 when she joined as a Probationer and in 1989, she was admitted as a Professional Member. In 1999, she was elevated to the category of Fellow after having been an active member and serving the Institution in different capacities.

She has served on various Committees including the 25th Anniversary Planning Committee, the



Quantity Surveying Education & Membership Committee, and the 1992 Presidential Ball Planning Committee. She has also chaired the International Affairs, Secretariat Re-structuring, Website, and the 43rdAGM & 7thSurveyors Week Planning Committees. She was one of the Examiners for the Quantity Surveying Division's'Practical Application of Quantities' paper for five years.

She has been serving on the Governing Council of the Ghana Institution of Surveyors since 2010. From 2013 to 2016 Rosemargaret was the Chairperson of the Quantity Surveying Division of the GhIS – the first woman to hold the position. During this period, she led the strategic moves of strengthening the Quantity Surveying Division's regional presence in the country, as well as highlighting Globalization and ICT for Quantity Surveyors.

Rosemargaret has also been a Council Member of the Africa Association of Quantity Surveyors (AAQS) since 2013. Currently, she is the AAQS Vice President for the Western Region of Africa.

Following the Collaboration and signing of a Memorandum of Understanding between GhIS with RICS in 2013, Rosemargaret has been the Coordinator for Relations between the two Institutions. During the last six years, she has been a member of the RICS Sub-Saharan Africa Market Advisory Panel.

She has served on different Industry wide Committees including the Built Environment Stakeholder Consultation for 'Developing a Circular Economy Action Plan for Ghana' (2022), Technical Committee for 'Ensuring Value for Money in Roads, Education and Health Infrastructure Delivery in Ghana' (2018), UN-Habitat Expert Group Meeting on 'Women in sustainable housing: from concept to hard hat' (2015) held in Nairobi, Kenya.

Professional Values

Rosemargaret believes ethical behaviour must be paramount in the work of Surveyors and that integrity must be demonstrated in the services they provide. She believes *"Our standard should stand the test of any measure; the service we offer as Professional Surveyors must be up to the required standard in any part of the world."*


Personal Values

He was a tutor at the University of Reading, UK and is currently a Lecturer in Real Estate Development, Sustainability, and Investment Appraisal at KNUST.


Kenneth is also co-founder and Managing Director of PropIntel Limited, a real estate investment consulting and skills training company.

MEMBERS AND FIRMS IN GOOD STANDING, 2022

The Governing Council of the Ghana Institution of Surveyors (GhIS) presents the underlisted fully paid up Individual Members and Practising Firms IN GOOD STANDING, for the information of all Government Ministries, Departments, Agencies/Parastatals, Metropolitan, Municipal and District Assemblies, Public and Private Corporate Bodies and the General Public.

Furthermore, the Governing Council strongly advises the above-mentioned employers to use Surveyors and Firms it recognizes, who are thus bound by its Constitution, Code of Conduct and Ethics, Disciplinary Procedures, Conditions of Engagement and Rules of Conduct. This is reinforced by Section 18(3) of NRCD143 which mandates the GhIS to present the names of Members in Good Standing to the Registrar-General for Registration and states:

"No person shall practice any profession in respect of which a professional body has been registered under this Decree unless he has been duly registered by the Registrar under this Section"

This registration on an annual basis which applies to Ghanaians and non-Ghanaians alike ensures that only technically competent and capable persons are permitted to practice the surveying profession in a safe and responsible manner in Ghana. Any person intending to practice for less than 12 months in Ghana shall apply for temporary registration.

Firms that provide professional surveying services must be staffed by registered surveying professionals and such firms are recognised on an annual basis by the GhIS and are given Certificates to that effect.

Enforcement of the law is thus an essential safeguard for society and is of public good.

Failure to ensure that surveying services are obtained from registered surveying professionals and recognized firms amounts to a breach of Section 21 of NRCD 143 which states:

"Where an offence under this Decree is committed by a body of persons then every president, vice-president, chairman, vicechairman, director or partner and every officer of that body shall also be guilty of that offence if he is proved to have directly or indirectly whether by any act or omission permitted to be done the act or omission which constitutes the offence."

The Governing Council further advises employers and the general public to insist on evidence of membership certification in Good Standing, especially before employing or awarding commissions to persons and firms respectively.
